HOW TO WRITE A THEATRICAL BIO

A bio (biography) is written in the <u>third person</u> and should include past shows and other performance experience. Remember that your bio is a means to introduce yourself to the theatre community. There will be many people who don't know you as an actor, and your bio is an excellent way to communicate with the audience.

Please consider the following guidelines when writing your bio:

PAST SHOWS/ROLES with Theatre Arts School of San Diego (TAS+SD) OTHER SHOWS and ROLES WHAT YOU LIKE ABOUT TAS+SD and THEATRE SPECIAL INTERESTS, AWARDS SHORT PERSONAL MESSAGE

This will be Maria's third production at TAS+SD (Mad Hatter, *The Queen of Hearts*, Adriana, *The Comedy of Errors*). Other favorite roles include: Fiona in *Shrek* (SCPA), Ida in *Honk!* (Lamb's Player's Theatre Summer Program), and most recently, Brooke in *Legally, Blonde* (Moonlight Youth Theatre.)
